What is MRI?

Magnetic Resonance Imaging is a way for doctors to look inside the body without using radiation. Instead it uses radio waves combined with a very powerful magnet.

What to expect

When you first arrive at Open Skies, you will be greeted by our friendly receptionist who will ask for your information in order to process your request. At the same time, if you haven't already filled one out, she will give you an MRI checklist for information on any previous surgeries. This is mandatory for anyone who enters the MRI suite.

If a contrast dye injection is required for your exam, you will be given a 2nd form to fill out. She will then pass this information on to the technologist who will go through it with you and answer any questions that you may have. You will then be asked to change into metal free clothes. The exam will last anywhere from 15 minutes to 1 hour. The openness of our scanner makes for a more comfortable experience and is not restrictive compared to closed bore scanners. It is important to remain still for the duration of the exam in order to obtain clear pictures. You will be given a button to hold which will sound an alarm in the control area if you need to communicate with the technologist.

Once the exam is finished you will be free to change and be on your way. Your physician will then contact you once the results are available.

General Instructions

- Please bring your Saskatchewan Health Card. Also bring any implant cards from previous surgeries that you have.
- Please leave all jewelry, piercings, bobby pins, hair clips, etc., at home. For safety metallic items are not allowed in the MRI suite.
- Please arrive 30 minutes prior to your appointment. If you are late, your appointment may have to be rescheduled.
- 4) Kindly notify the office ASAP if you have to cancel or rebook this procedure. This way we can utilize the appointment for another patient.
- 5) If you require any form of oral sedation, please ask your doctor for a prescription and organize transportation as you will be told not to drive for 24 hrs.
- You will be asked to remove all medication patches prior to your exam, so bring a replacement.
- 7) You can eat and drink as you please for every exam except for abdominal and pelvic. For these exams you will be given specific instructions when you are contacted with appointment information.
